2. Adoption of the minutes of June 15, 2021

The minutes of the October 2020 meeting were approved unanimously, by those present at that meeting, on a motion by J. Leoci, seconded by A. Zanello, with the following corrections:

3. Business Arising

3.1 – COSTCO donations – last two \$300 installments

• all donations have been earmarked for students needs as necessary (may be used for such items as clothing, food, other necessities, etc.) at the discretion of the school administration (with a report to GB). See also October minutes (recap below).

Donations and earmarks approved unanimously on a motion by A. Zanello, seconded By G. Tullio.

From the October 2020 minutes:

- Costco will continue its \$1200 annual donation (\$300 per quarter) for the current school year
 - -- Last year's donation went mostly to buy food for a number of underprivileged families In our community.
 - -- this year's first quarter donation of \$300 went to purchase school clothes, under garments, winter hats and neck warmers
- The pallet of ESKA water (donated by J. Leoci will be used at different school events

 - -- V. Guerriero will reach out to last year's list of donors/sponsors
- Foreseeing same #s as last year approx. 60 baskets

5. Principal's / Vice-Principal's Report

- Sex Education program as per Ministry dictates, which sees this as an important program (this is not a school decision, but a Ministry decision)
 - -- Sec 1-5
 - -- should be in place by January 2021
 - -- at beginning phase as teachers buy in and are trained (who teaches and when)
 - * training by consultant
 - * it was made clear that personal beliefs are to remain personal and not passed on in the classroom
 - -- parents will be informed
 - -- not just about sexual relations but also includes relationships, well being, body image, emotional, etc., and content will be age appropriate and using "proper" language
 - -- there is no opt-out condition except for religious and mental health considerations
- Covid: As of November 15th, students were not required to wear masks in class but had to continue doing so in common areas
 - -- current protocol is to inform Santé publique if there is a case, but the entire class does not necessarily have to shut down
 - -- there have been no further cases as JFK to date
- Budgets: all budgets have come in and are healthy
- Progress Report Friday Nov 19th, no parent/teacher interview this time around, will have one with first report card
- Tutors: Ministry to Board to School (after school: own staff)

- Nov 13th National Kindness Day, so in this spirit Aim High will have a socks and candy cane projects whose proceeds will be given to the Mackay Center.
- Spirit of Giving live at JFK
 - -- will spotlight school and provide opportunity to show why we are known as the small school with a BIG heart!

The JFK and CJE partnership is going well. The first student the Alice from CJE worked with succeeded in getting the position he applied for. Red Cross Babysitting Certificate training course is ongoing. Presently have 6 students who have signed up; a minimum of 10 is required. If don't get 10, will try to negotiate with Instructor and review pricing.

<u>Camp Lift</u> school program, should be starting by the end of Nov. We are gathering names for participant. This year we are hoping to have two groups running at the same time – 1 junior, 1 senior. Students participating will be informed that they are responsible For any class work when they are in the group. This year this Program is at no cost to JFK students.

<u>Girls Self-Defense Course</u> – is being planned with the Montreal Assault Prevention Centre for Feb 14, a PED day. It is being Announced now so that if we have more than expected that are Interested, a second date can be booked. \$10 deposit fee to ensure commitment.

Santé publique pilot project with JFK – the guidance counselor, Mr. Alex Beckford, and Gerry Tullio will be meeting representatives of Santé publique, looking at mental health. Will be looking at what we have at JFK and how they can help improve or increase those services. Along with helping us find new mental health initiatives, which they will research, analyse and show how to implement at JFK.
